SANCTUARY REMODEL

One of our most exciting changes in 2013 was the remodeling of our sanctuary. In 2011, we worked with an architect to make plans for a future sanctuary remodel. That work helped us identify several needs including: more lighting, total sound system replacement, adjusted front seating for flexibility and warmth, a permanently installed video projection system, and a more ideal choir seating arrangement... just to name a few. The architect's great plan to solve these issues came with a \$1.4 million price tag. Although the concepts were solid, the cost was too high.

At the January 15, 2013 Session meeting, the Elders wrestled with the idea of moving the early service to the sanctuary because that service had grown well over the occupancy maximum for the chapel. Moving out of the newly remodeled chapel, which had been a home for this service for decades, was tough but it was also the only way to continue to welcome more people to worship. We knew that the sound, video and "warmth" issues needed to be resolved before the 9:30 service would feel at home in the sanctuary. So, without a budget or a total plan, the Session stepped out in faith, believing that over the next 10.5 weeks God would provide the plan, money and contractors to reopen the renovated sanctuary by Easter morning.



Matt Merrill and Todd Robinson headed this project. Inspired by 2011 plans, they began to sketch out the redesign. With help from the Trustees, John Weber, Becky Ramsey, Lisa Dorsey, Tech Painting, David Wilson, and Duane Lomis, a great plan came together. By God's grace, all of the contractors agreed to work within our tight schedule. Work went on at all hours of the day and night! During the same time, the Little Falls Presbyterian Church Foundation and many in the congregation gave generously. Now we have a great new worship space for both of our services featuring:

- A flexible chancel that has the choir front and center
- Lighting that allows everyone to be seen
- An installed video projection that is not intrusive
- Clear, crisp sound
- A warm, inviting design including the stage thrust
- More architectural emphasis on the main stained-glass window

The plan finished on time and Easter 2013 was glorious! During those 10.5 weeks, we raised \$103,000 for the project, which was exactly what it costed. Glory to God for His provision of this great worship space.

Music and Story Time



YOUTH



Well what can we say about 2013? It was a year filled with studies about Jesus, the first confirmation class in five years, new opportunities for discipleship and some of the most fun events around. This past year we wanted to study three main areas: who Jesus was, what He has done, and what we should be doing as his disciples. We studied the Gospels and later on in the year Paul's books. We committed to building community through a variety of fun yet teachable events. We wanted to get our church and parents more involved in the lives of our teens and we wanted for our teens to grow in their faith. Here are some highlights of those goals.

This past year we introduced DNow, which is an overnight discipleship weekend. Families from our church volunteered their homes for kids to stay while volunteer leaders guided them through a study about living their



faith out. The weekend culminated with a summary of the teaching, free Chic-Fil-A lunch and an assortment of crazy games. We even made a hilarious video!!

Another exciting event was our junior high summer trip called FUGE. We traveled to Ridgecrest, North Carolina to a summer camp that focused on worshipping Jesus Christ and building community among teens.


Women's Retreat

COMMUNITY SERVICE

It was another terrific year for Community Service at Little Falls. We shared our financial blessings with 15 local Arlington community organizations that provide assistance to our friends and neighbors. Some additional service highlights of the year include:

- At Easter we gave the 14 children at the two Doorways for Woman and Children shelters each a Jesus Storybook Bible and treat-filled Easter baskets. We also gave each of the 10 moms at the shelters a Starbucks gift card and filled enough eggs for each shelter to host an egg hunt for the families.
- Back in April, we once again sponsored the ever popular Shred-for-Bread event to benefit the Arlington Food Assistance Center (AFAC). Through the generosity of our friends and neighbors, we were able to donate significant checks and food stuffs to our local community. Shred-for-Bread is one of AFAC's largest donation events of the year. Many thanks to the Yoder family for once again organizing and promoting this important annual event, and to the Boy Scouts for distributing flyers, which greatly increased the publicity and turnout.
- During the summer, VBC families, along with the congregation, filled 10 backpacks with school supplies and Target gift cards for new school clothes for Doorways children; we also gave extra school supplies for the shelter to have on hand.
- In August, we were able to serve our partners at Arlington Bridge Builders (ABB) by supporting its backpack drive. On the day it distributed the backpacks (250!), it was also able to organize a barbecue luncheon for the recipients and their families.

- At Thanksgiving we put together food baskets for 11 families in Arlington. The highlight of this event was a terrific effort, led by Julie Verry, where the youth created beautiful artwork to share with these families along with Bibles for the children.



- Christmas was a little brighter for some of our neighbors both near and far. Through Operation Christmas Child we provided 108 boxes of toys, toiletries and other gifts for children around the world.



- Locally, our parishioners bought and wrapped Christmas presents for 50 children who worship at the Iglesia de Dios Jesus El Buen Pastor and Iglesia de Dios El Jordan.

BUILDING & GROUNDS

The most significant accomplishment this past year was the sanctuary changes to accommodate the 9:30 a.m. contemporary service, which had outgrown the chapel (see Sanctuary Remodel for the full update).



A popular addition to the narthex was a 50-inch television. Now we enjoy photos of activities that take place throughout the week in the life of our church. Many thanks to Gregg Kurasz, Ruth and



Abby Hudock, Dick MacEwen and Paul Schomburg who regularly contribute to capturing these memories for us!

Erwin Hall has taken on a new look thanks to the efforts of Chris and Katie Lugo and the Trustees. Chris and Katie painted and redecorated the living room area and the Trustees arranged for a new tile floor in the basement.

The HVAC systems are showing their age. One of the three residential type units servicing the office and chapel areas failed and was replaced, and one of the three air handling units that provides air conditioning to the sanctuary stopped working. The unit is scheduled for replacement this spring, in time for the cooling season. The unit is located in the steeple which will complicate the replacement and add to the cost. A boiler and chiller, the main sources of heat and cooling for the Sanctuary and Tree House addition, have outlived their useful life and require increasing maintenance to keep them operating. In anticipation of their replacement, the Trustees contracted with PEG consultants to carry out an evaluation of our HVAC system and a phased replacement program. The boiler is scheduled for replacement next summer as part of the first phase. To keep up with increasing maintenance, the Trustees hired two new maintenance

companies to replace the current contractor that was not meeting our expectations. The new contractors have been performing well.

We have Boy Scout John Voss to thank for an improvement to our grounds. John is a member of Troup 638, sponsored by the church and also a church member. For his Eagle Scout project, John installed nine new benches and a cross to the outdoor chapel. With the addition of the benches, the outdoor chapel now seats 90 people.



CHURCH FINANCIAL HEALTH

The Administration and Finance (A&F) Ministry Team's primary responsibility is to be faithful stewards over the financial resources God has entrusted to us. The team does this through developing the annual budget and, with the assistance of the Treasurers and the Financial Secretary, monitoring the monthly income and disbursement of church funds and our overall cash position. In addition, the team is responsible for the annual stewardship campaign, overseeing personnel policies, and works with the Trustees to ensure adequate funding to maintain our facilities.

God continued to bless us financially in 2013:

- While we budgeted for a deficit of \$41,000, we had a surplus of \$42,000.

- Offerings were up 15 percent over 2012, with average attendance up 12 percent.
- The \$104,000 sanctuary renovation cost was primarily funded through the generosity of the congregation and funds from the Little Falls Presbyterian Church Foundation. Only \$22,000 in existing memorial funds were used to help fund the project.
- Our cash balance at the end of the year was virtually unchanged. Our \$42,000 surplus offset the funds used for the sanctuary renovation as well as other building improvements.
- Pledges for 2014 are up 12 percent over 2013 pledges.

We are blessed to have the talents and dedication of so many in carrying out our mission. John Dubeck and Susan Hotine continued to serve as Co-Treasurers in 2013; Hillary Schaeffler continued to serve as Assistant Treasurer; and Sarah Lindsay continued as Financial Secretary, maintaining individuals' contribution records, assisting with tabulating and analyzing the results of the stewardship campaign, and helping with income projections for 2014. Patti Yoder provided her extensive expertise in organizational human resources to guide us in a review process for Matt and our paid staff, with oversight from our Elders and input from many in the congregation. Suzanne Swenson contributed many hours and her gift of writing to update our Building Use and Website Privacy policies. Many in our congregation also serve faithfully as counters each Sunday. We thank all of them for contributing their gifts and many hours of their time.

Finally, we would like to thank the Trustees, and in particular Jim Whitehead, who served as the Trustees' representative to A&F, for continuing to build a strong working relationship with A&F.
